After the twelfth day of Christmas comes the season of Epiphany. The word: Epiphany, however, precedes the Christian



era. The word itself is Greek but the concept pertains to the revelation of the divine to humanity and is a theme that transcends many different religions. Epiphany for ancient Judaism was almost always an event that was accompanied by sheer terror. When Jehovah presented himself, typically in the form a heavenly messenger (angel), even those fully devoted to Him were petrified by fear. So the common New Testament angelic greeting, which we read over Christmas when angels appeared to announce the coming of the baby Jesus, is "be not afraid."

While Christianity does share much in common with other religions, what sets it apart is that accompanying the Christian version of Epiphany is the unique preface: "be not afraid." Even prior to Jesus' birth we find this unusual even strange/counter-intuitive greeting. Never in human imagination could people have conceived that a divine appearance should be qualified by the commandment to not be fearful. It is this that makes Christianity a religion of hope, comfort, peace and love. In the season of Epiphany we are confronted with the Divine that when revealed still instills us with a sense of overwhelming awe but never sheer and unqualified horror. Through Christ, God has introduce Himself as a God of love. This is the heart of the gospel and the source of our earthly and eternal hope.

I'd like to leave you with a small portion of Wikipedia's description of "Epiphany":

In Christianity, the Epiphany refers to a realization that Christ is the son of God. Western churches generally celebrate the Visit of the Magi as the revelation of the Incarnation of the infant Christ, and commemorate the Feast of the Epiphany on January 6. Traditionally, Eastern churches celebrated Epiphany (or Theophany) in conjunction with Christ's baptism by John the Baptist and celebrated it on January 19; however, many have begun to adopt the Western custom of celebrating it on January 6, the twelfth day of Christmas. Protestant churches often celebrate Epiphany as a season, extending from the last day of Christmas until Ash Wednesday.

Ole E. Kragnes Dies Wednesday

January 8, 1942

Had Been Prominent in Township Affairs

Ole E. Kragnes, 68, died Wednesday night at his farm home northeast of Kragnes after an illness of several months.

Prominent in township affairs, Mr. Kragnes included among the offices held during his residence in the county those of treasurer of the township, school board clerk, and deacon of Concordia Church. He was born in Houston County January 12, 1873, moving with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. A. O. Kragnes to Clay County in 1875. Kragnes Township was named after his father. Miss Anne Louise Erickson and he were married December 26, 1898, at Concordia Church.

Surviving in addition to Mrs. Kragnes are eight sons and a daughter: Allard and Henry, in Moorhead; Ernest, Lloyd Minister, Sask., Canada; Oberlin, Edward and Abner, at the farm home; Lester, Baltimore MD; and Mrs. John Lufgren, Glyndon. There were 12 children born to the couple. Brothers who survive are Gilbert, Felton; Ben and Alvin, Glyndon; and Oliver, Sturgess, Sask, Canada. There are two grandchildren.

Funeral services have not been arranged. The body is at the Merril Moore mortuary, Fargo.

Ole was more commonly known as Emanuel.

January 9, 1942

Services for Ole E. Kragnes, prominent Kragnes township resident who died Wednesday will be held Saturday at 2:00 p.m. in Concordia Church. Reverend C. B. Runsvold, Moorhead, will officiate. Interment will be in the church cemetery.

Miss Juve, 71, of Moland Dies

January 10, 1936

Miss Oline Juve, lifelong resident of Moland Township, died this morning at the home of her sister, Mrs. Theodore Skree in that township.

Miss Juve was born June 14, 1865, and had been making her home with Mrs. Skree for the past 15 years.

Surviving in addition to Mrs. Skree are a brother, Nicholas Juve, who makes his home with a cousin and Alden Juve in Kragnes Township; O.T., M.R., and T. J. Skree of Moland Township; Robert Olson, at the Skree farm; Orvil Osmundson, Rudolph Bergland, Gena Bergland, and Mrs. Leon Hammett, Moorhead, all cousins of Miss Juve.

Services will be held Sunday at 2 p.m. in the Leo Johnson chapel and at 3 p.m. in the Concordia Church on the Buffalo River near Kragnes. Rev. J. M. Moe of the Olivet Lutheran Church in Fargo will officiate and interment will be in the family lot beside the church.

Pallbearers will be three Skree brothers, Alden Juve, Rudolph Bergland and Robert Olson.
