We are in the season of Pentecost. The first day of Pentecost was marked when the followers of the risen Christ were gathered and the Holy Spirit descended upon them giving them various



speaking abilities of many different countries by which they would be empowered to convey the gospel to the world. The disciples were spiritually inspired and might be considered the first truly spiritual people in the history of the church.

The word, "spiritual" has gained much popularity of late, particularly among those who have separated from or have never been connected to the Church or any religion. More and more we encounter people who say that they are "spiritual but not religious," meaning that they have no interest in a corporate identity of any kind but are totally self-contained in their spiritual nurture and expression. They are not necessarily atheistic or even hostile to organized religion but claim to have charted their own independent course where they account only to themselves and depend only on themselves for inspiration, nurture or direction. However, according to recent independent studies, such individuals rarely pray, meditate, ponder the meaning of life or their role in the cosmos and most importantly, describe little involvement in pursuing the best interests of their communities or the less fortunate in those communities or beyond. In other words, according to what the great religions of the world understand as "spirituality," they are largely AWOL (Absent Without Leave) and cannot not to be understood as spiritual at all.

Recently studies of hundreds of such individuals that claim this moniker indicate that spirituality of any kind, actually has little or no role in their lives; they are simple not affiliated with any religion at all and have chosen to live their lives with little concern for anyone other than themselves or their families and closest friends. Given that "me first" has become primary guiding motto for most Westerners, it should be of no surprise that they should reject religion which has not only universal truth claims with implications for how we are to live our day to day lives, but also reject the great historical religions which have an accumulated wisdom based not just on the personal experience of the isolated individual, but on the experiences of centuries of people who have lived lives of integrity in pursuit of the ideals embodied by the tenets of these religions.

This Pentecost we are reminded that our personal spirituality is rooted in the resurrection of Jesus Christ and the sending of his Spirit into his disciples the day of Pentecost. You and I are his present day disciples, claimed in our baptisms for a life of following Jesus, sustained by his Spirit through regular participation with our siblings in the faith, the Church, and participating with this community in receiving the means of grace through his Church in the form of Word and Sacrament.

Next month I would like to dedicate my entire column to a recently departed brother in the Lord, Francis Cardinal George of Chicago, who addressed the issue I have attempted to address, that there is not such thing as "spiritual but not religious," with great clarity, succinctness and power.

Leroy Horpedahl, cont'd from right-hand column

He is survived by Alice and their three sons: Gary, David and Paul. He is also survived by his brother, Harold Horpedahl (Sally) of Moorhead and sister Ruth Farabee (Bill) of Wilmington, NC.

Leroy Horpedahl (1924-2015)

LeRoy Horpedahl passed away in his home on April 27 after a long struggle with Parkinson's and other ailments. His last days were spent comfortably in his home surrounded by family and lots of visits from friends. He was 91 years old.

LeRoy was born at home on the farm, one of six children of immigrant Norwegian parents in the rural farming community of Glyndon, Minnesota, April 13, 1924. He attended a one-room elementary school in the country, then boarded in town so he could attend high school. His enlistment in the Navy enabled him to obtain a Bachelor's degree in Mechanical Engineering from the University of Minnesota through the Navy V12 program and was trained as an officer in the Navy at Notre Dame.

Discharged from active duty, LeRoy married the love of his life, Alice Hammett, and they began their 67 year adventure together! He worked as a lineman for the local power company, then moved to Indiana where he taught at Tri-State University. The opportunity to earn a Master's degree took him to Montana State University in Bozeman, Montana. From there, he disappeared with his family into the Secret City: Los Alamos, New Mexico. Planning on a brief stay in this mountain community, LeRoy and Alice have made it home for almost 64 years.

LeRoy spent 45 years working on projects for Los Alamos National Laboratory, moving from the ranks of professional engineers into a management level at the lab. He was also very active in the life of Bethlehem Lutheran Church and many other organizations.

During the early years of his retirement, he and Alice were able to travel much of the world, including trips to China, Japan, Australia and New Zealand, Alaska, the Panama Canal, France, Italy, England, Africa and, of course, Norway, where the Norwegian he was taught as a young boy in America was still tinged with an accent that identified his father's origin in Fjaerland.

The Cerro Grande fire destroyed their home and a life's worth of memorabilia, family heirlooms and photos. However, LeRoy and Alice tackled the job of re-building, designing a comfortable Southwest-style home on the same site. They were able to care for their daughter, Kristine, while she fought and finely succumbed to the ravages of Lupus at the young age of 49.

LeRoy's last few years have been in the loving care of his wife Alice and a number of nurses and caregivers. Whoever tucked him in at night received his selfless gift of: "Thank you for a wonderful day!" Whoever visited experienced the amazing light in his eyes and broad smile as he greeted them. He loved telling everyone about his family and the exciting things they were doing. He was clearly so proud of them all! Clay Pioneer Woman Dead

Mrs. Gunder O. Lee, 86, pioneer Clay resident since 1871, died Wednesday night at her farm home, four miles north of Watts Siding, Moland Township. She was ill for a short time only.

Born in Telemarken, Norway, January 12, 1857, she came to this country with her parents in 1861. Her father and mother, the late Mr. and Mrs. Ole G. Thortvedt, first settled in Houston County in 1861. Ten years later they migrated to Clay County and homesteaded in what is now Moland Township. Mrs. Lee has made her home there since that time.

Thone Thortvedt before her marriage, she was married in Moland Township July 6, 1875. She was active in church affairs of the community and was a charter member of Concordia Lutheran Church and its ladies aid. Mr. Lee died in 1929.

Survivors include two sons, four daughters, a sister, 12 grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

Pina Colada Salad**











Ingredients

- 1 ½ cups green grapes
- 1 ½ cups red grapes
- 1 ½ cups blueberries
- 1 ½ cups strawberries, halved
- 1 cup pineapple chunks (8 oz can, drained)
- ½ cup raspberries
- 1 can frozen pina colada mix, thawed
- ½ cup sugar
- ½ cup pineapple-orange juice
- 1/8 tsp almond extract
- 1/8 tsp coconut extract
- ¾ cup grated coconut

Directions

- Mix fruit in large serving bowl
 - In a small bowl, whisk together pina colada mix, sugar, juice and extracts until sugar dissolves. Pour over fruit.
 - Refrigerate
 - Sprinkle grated coconut on top just before serving
